All employees are to be aware that in the event of any conflict between the demands of work and safety, they will receive support if they reasonably choose the safety of themselves or third parties as the priority.

The Company will carry out a regular review of this policy and all risk assessments to ensure that the highest standards of health and safety are maintained.
