“ To protect the public by promoting high standards of professional conduct and professional education, training and competence among registrants of the designated professions ”

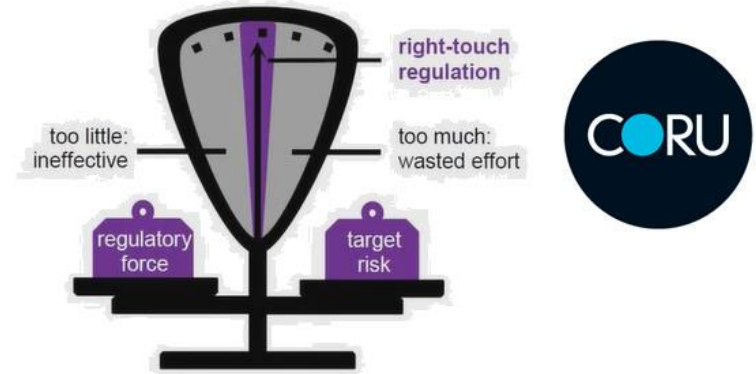

Professional Regulatory Interventions

- Improve quality of care
- Set standards of competency
- Encourage continuing professional development and education
- Identify the competence of the individual practitioner
- Reassure the public about the competence of health and social care professionals

Right Touch Regulation Principles



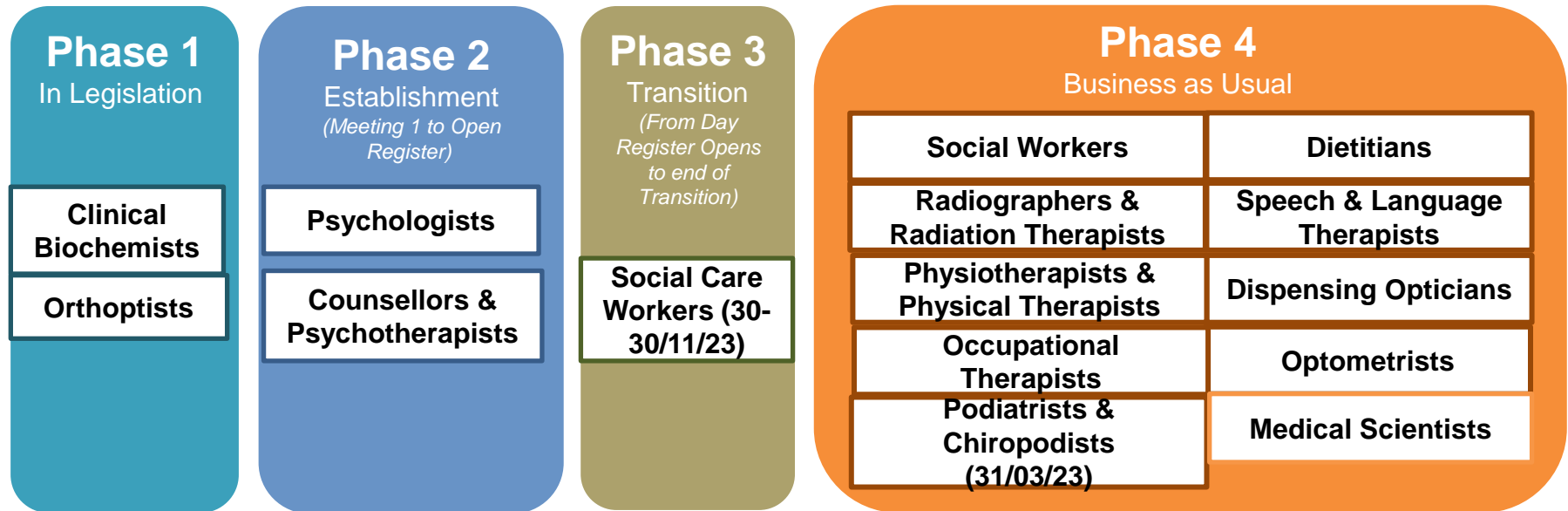
Regulators must be

- **Proportionate:** only intervene where necessary
- **Consistent:** rules and standards are fair
- **Targeted:** focused on the problem
- **Transparent:** be open - keep regulations simple and user friendly
- **Accountable:** must justify decisions and be subject to public scrutiny
- **Agile:** must look forward and be able to adapt to anticipate change

Registration Requirements



- User-friendly and streamlined application process
- Visit the CORU website to get started
- Evidence of Qualification(s)
- Evidence of Identity
- Fit and Proper Questionnaire (Health & Character)

Additional Requirements



- eVetting and international Police Clearance
- Statutory Declaration
- Confirmation of good standing with other international regulator
- Employment History/Evidence of Practice (S91)/(S38)

Additional Fee / Next Steps



- €100 fee required for application processing
- Secure payment options available
- Visit www.coru.ie to begin your application on the 30 November 2023

The Standard Route (Section 38)



- For new entrants and returning professionals
- Applicable for CORU-recognized international qualifications
- Open for the lifetime of the register
- Adapts to evolving requirements and bye-laws
- Language testing and return-to-practice provisions when needed

Grandparenting (Section 91)

TEMPORARY
ROAD

- Open for two years from the date the register first opens
- Transition period for existing practitioners to statutory regulation/registration
- Legal provisions under s91 for professionals practicing in the State
- Recognizes equivalent qualifications, employer opinions, and reciprocal arrangements
- Assessment of Professional Competence for applicants without qualifications
- Requires evidence of engagement in the profession for 2 out of 5 years on the date of application

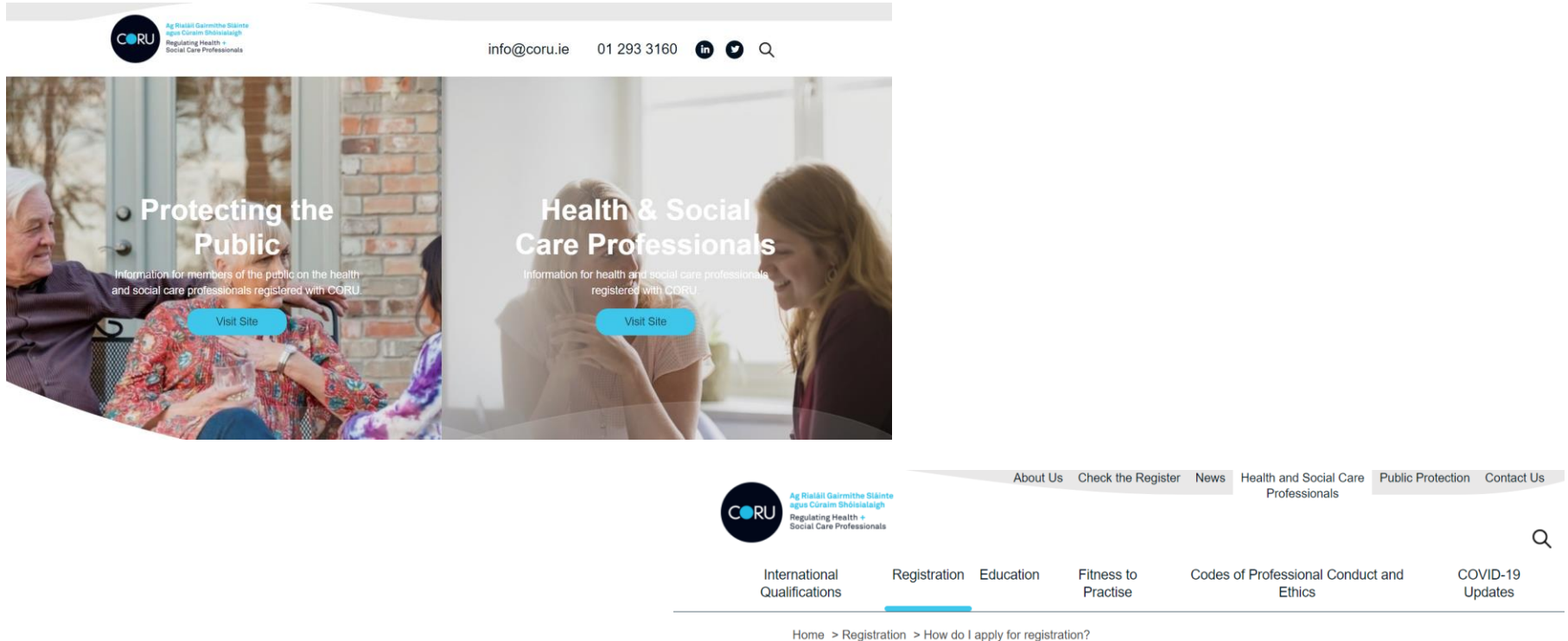
Social Care Workers Registration Board

In summary...



- Board is working towards opening the register
- Existing practitioners have 2 routes onto the register
- It is the social care worker's responsibility to be registered
- Employer's role is to ensure employment practices reflect registration requirements
- Using the protected title – must be registered
