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


WHAT IS SOCIAL PEDAGOGY?

HOW DOES THIS CONNECT TO YOUR PRACTICE?

The 3 ps the professional, personal and private self



The Professional Self: Specific knowledge and expertise relevant for practice, e.g. understanding relevant interdisciplinary theory, insight into legal, ethical and professional frameworks, interpersonal and methodological skills.



The Personal Self: Own values, life experiences, interests, and personal qualities to increase the quality of support and deepen human-to-human relationships.



The Private Self: Experiences that are irrelevant for practice, interests and life aspects that we would share with close friends or family but otherwise keep to ourselves, or experiences that are too raw and unprocessed.

Basis:	Professional Competence	Objectivity	Subjectivity, Emotional
Knowledge / insight:	Theoretical knowledge e.g. laws & policies	Processed experiences, self-awareness	Own experiences (more or less proccesed)
Actions characterised by:	Analysis, Methods, Evaluation	A sense of situation, Empathy	Emotive, Chance
Approach to collaboration:	Multi-disciplinary	Willingness and eagerness to co-operate	Pursuing one's own agenda
Needs:	Others	Others /own	Own



SOCIAL PEDAGOGY IN SOCIAL CARE

Social pedagogy provides a meaningful perspective for social care because it is:

- Starting from the inherent capabilities and potential of each human being and community
- Dialogical and participatory to navigate complexity and ensure people have a genuine voice, feel respected and develop agency
- Relationship-centred and strengthening people's relational universes
- Integrative and coherent speaks to a broad range of professionals, with strong ethical and theoretical foundations
- Focussed both on practice and structures
- Attuned to social justice issues and matters of marginalisation / social exclusion
